Track My Steps is a nonprofit organization that advocates and train parents with economically disadvantage, disable, and at-risk children entering or currently attending public school systems. Parental support begins with children from birth to high school. By collaborating with parents, community organizations, businesses, educators,



and elected officials, Track My Steps works to close the economic and racial achievement gaps that keep all

children from attaining the same high levels of success.

Track My Steps focuses on increasing parental involvement in the education process by helping parents understand school expectations, student accountability, and student rights. We also provide parents the tools and skill-sets to be an advocate for their child. Through our initiatives, workshops, advocacy, and other education resources Track My Steps exists to help children succeed in school, graduate on time, and prepare for college, and the workforce.

are facilitated in various counties across North Carolina. An education advocate is available to speak to parents

concerning their **rights** and **resources** for school age children. A free 30 minute Laugh & Learn (LL) session for pre-k is available for children ages 2-5, with parent participation. Registration and parent attendance is required during the entire LL session.

Ready, Set, Read. Developed for Kindergarten through 5th graders. Ready, Set, Read promotes the reading and comprehension skills that will serve as the foundation of all student success.

Operation MIDDLE. The ability to transition from elementary to middle school is a key indicator of a positive middle school experience. We offer support and guidance for both parent and student through this transition.

Race to 100. This program for 9th—12th graders emphasizes the importance of graduating on time and

being prepared for college or the workforce.

How to Participate

Track My Steps families are referred to us by school administrators, human services agencies or other nonprofit organizations. Track My Steps families donate \$10/per 9 weeks or \$40/ per school calendar year for up to 4 siblings per household (4 children only \$10. total per household). Families must complete a short form to qualify.
